Dear Families,

It has been a busy, productive start to the year. We are getting to know one another and establishing routines and procedures. Thank you for checking your child's red assignment book each night.

Science

Our focus on the local biosphere at Buttermilk Falls State Park has led us to look closely at species which could upset the balance of the ecosystem. The students are researching individual species at writing time. To conclude our study of living things, we have conducted experiments to look at producers (plants) and decomposers (redworms). We are taking a End-of-Unit assessment on Friday, and the students will be able to use their notebooks to assist them. Moving forward, we will be learning more about the other spheres: atmosphere, geosphere, and hydrosphere, and how the spheres interact. This will engage students in understanding and making models in science.

Student-led Conferences

During your child's upcoming conference, they will present an electronic portfolio. This portfolio will showcase samples of their work and outline goals for the school year. The parent/teacher/student team will discuss plans to meet their goals.

Reading

Each student should have a good fit chapter book to read at school.

Soon we will begin our first book club meetings for the year. Each student will be reading a realistic fiction book. Most of these books are award winners. We will meet in clubs twice a week to further discuss the book and make connections. Upon completion of the books, students will work on a project to share their books with others.

Writing

We are beginning our second unit of study focused on informational writing. This unit of study corresponds to our current science unit about the biosphere. Each student is researching one of the following invasive species that we discovered at our Buttermilk Falls field site: rusty crayfish, hemlock woolly adelgid, marmorated stink bug, or earthworms. They will be presenting their findings and recommendations in a few weeks after meeting with experts.

Math

The students will soon be completing Module 1 and will be taking a math assessment early next week. The assessment will focus on place value patterns, rounding and estimation. In addition, the students will be tested on adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing decimals. We will be starting Module 2, which emphasizes multiplication and division of whole numbers and decimals. The word problems will start to integrate measurement concepts.

Please work with your child on becoming fluent with their multiplication facts (1-10).



Read-Aloud

We have begun reading the book <u>Amal Unbound</u> which is a realistic fiction book set in Pakistan. The students will be working on a project in art class to highlight one of the themes of the book. To learn about the book, please visit
